

Reqtify is an interactive requirement traceability and impact analysis tool, which can trace requirements from system, program, and project levels to the entire levels of your software or hardware component development lifecycle. Reqtify can interface with requirement-related information in a wide variety of data formats, document types, and file formats. These can include corporate requirement repositories such as IBM-Rational DOORS™ and RequisitePro™, office type documents such as Microsoft Word, Excel, Adobe FrameMaker and PDF, UML Design tools such as Artisan Studio, Enterprise Architect, CAD tools such as Simulink, Code files such as C, Ada, C++, Java, or VHDL as well as information in standard text format, HTML, XML, or ReqIF.






Vector VectorCAST
